WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY

As we prepare to celebrate the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, we might well call to mind the Gospel reading for the day in which Jesus says: "Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation." This is all the more pertinent on the day Pope Benedict has dedicated as World Communications Day. This is our chance to affirm those working in the media and also to recognise that print, broadcast and new media technologies can, if used responsibly, be the tools of hope and truth spreading Christ's Gospel message far and wide. In his message for this year's Communications Day, the Holy Father recognises the impact new media has on young people and has a clear message for them to be online missionaries: "It falls, in particular, to young people, who have an almost spontaneous affinity for the new means of communication, to take on the responsibility for the evangelization of this 'digital continent'. Be sure to announce the Gospel to your contemporaries with enthusiasm. You know their fears and their hopes, their aspirations and their disappointments: the greatest gift you can give to them is to share with them the 'Good News' of a God who became man, who suffered, died and rose again to save all people." On World Communications Day, we ask the Catholic Community to keep communications professionals in our prayers and give generously to support the work of the Catholic Communications Network (CCN) - the media office of the Catholic Bishops' Conference.

FIRST READING: Acts 1:1-11

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. It is he had said what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit. Now having met together, they asked him, Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel? He replied, It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth. As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there. **This is the word of the Lord.**

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast.

SECOND READING: Ephesians 4:1-13

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! Go, make disciples of all the nations; I am with you always; yes, to the end of time. Alleluia!

GOSPEL READING: Mark 16:15-20

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven, and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised will be saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.' And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it. **This is the Gospel of the Lord.**
